

about any given subject. What we typically find is this type of behavior is mostly limited to online discussions and debates where it is easy to speak without a filter; and without having to look and speak to other participants face-to-face.



Case in point. An in-person town hall meeting on the proposed Splash Park project was held on Saturday, April 23, during Spring Fling Weekend. The meeting was presented by the many Property Owner volunteers and staff who spent the last year and many weekend hours investigating and developing the information on this project for your consideration. It was attended by more than 100 Property Owners in-person and about another 30 by Zoom. Despite the wide range of opinions, the meeting was informative, productive, and, most impor-

tantly, civil. If you were unable to attend and are looking for more information on the project before you make your decision, we encourage you to go to Woodhaven's YouTube channel and give it a watch. This meeting really did renew our faith that constructive discussions can take place on such a polarizing subject. While you will probably receive your paper copy of the Woodhaven News at your home after Memorial Weekend, an information booth will be set up about the Splash Park project on Sunday, May 29, at the Open-Air Market. Please, make time to stop by the information booth, ask questions, share opinions, and thank the volunteers for their time and efforts—whether you are for or against the project. And, more importantly, vote! Ballots must be at the Sublette Post Office by June 10.

Speaking of voting, we have another important event in 2022 where your vote matters—the Board of Directors election. Affidavits for candidates were due Saturday, May 14. Seven Owners have submitted their intent to run for four open Board seats. Potential candidates are currently undergoing file reviews and lot inspections. Candidates have until June 11th to remove their names from consideration.

The Beast has been Tamed

Loch Ness Monster, Big Foot, Chupacabra, and Woodhaven's Shoe Eating Beast. This local mythical creature, stretching almost 200 feet in length, has been reported to lie in wait by the Rec Plex basketball courts to suck the shoes off unsuspecting and oftentimes forewarned victims. The Shoe Eating Beast really reared its head this past October when it claimed several shoes and gasp, a Croc, during the Haunted Trail event. Based on feedback from frightened Property Owners, our Maintenance Department has conquered the beast! This once-soggy ditch was filled in with more than 200 feet of culvert, covered over with dirt and seeded. Hopefully, this will be the last we hear of this fabled monster.

While not as exciting, Maintenance also completed additional drainage work in the Rec Plex area by installing tile in the open field south of the Multi-Purpose Room. This area is used by the Recreation Department for activities and would frequently have standing water, even during minimal rains.

Identified Flying Objects

You won't have to look too far up to the sky to see flying discs at Woodhaven. All 18 baskets of the Winding Trail Disc Golf course have been completed. The course is in the Rec Plex and General store area and features tee marker posts identified with each hole number. If you are new to the game, discs can be checked out from the Rec Plex mini-golf window, where scorecards and a course map are also available. Disc check-out requires a \$10 deposit, which will be returned when the discs are brought back. There are also Woodhaven branded driver discs available for purchase at the Rec Plex for \$20 each in a variety of colors.

Several of the holes traverse high traffic areas, so when enjoying the course, please be mindful and respectful of others in the area, including those walking the trail or enjoying the playground and Pool 1. While the course is very playable, we still plan on installing concrete tee pads on each hole later in the season. Additionally, watch for information on disc golf instructional sessions and tournaments through our Recreation Department on our Facebook page and in upcoming editions of the Leisure Times.

Unacceptable Materials

The paving portion of the Unacceptable Materials Drop-Off compound has been completed at the Maintenance Building. The dumpsters have been moved to the front area near Woodhaven Drive. The next phase will be to install the fencing, rolling gates, and additional video cameras. The gates will allow access to the dumpsters with the same Property Owner proximity cards used to access the Main Gate. We anticipate project completion in late summer.

Other News and Notes

- Auditors from Wipfli, LLP started their fieldwork to audit the Association's March 31, 2022 financial statement. The fieldwork portion of the audit has been completed, and we are working on the preliminary audit report for presentation to the Association's Audit Committee for review and approval.
- Woodhaven's website and mobile app were both recently redesigned and refreshed. If you experience any issues with the Property Owner password-protected site, please contact the Association Office for assistance.
- The new ice cream at the Rec Plex from Ashby's has been a huge hit. When you go in for your next scoop, make sure to pick up a flavor punch card. When you try all the flavors listed on the card, you receive a free pint of your choice.
- The Recreation Department is developing additional weekday afternoon adult and senior programs and events to be held at the Lakeview Building. Watch the online events calendar, Facebook, and <u>Leisure Times</u> for more information.
- The gate arms and hardware at the Main Gate have been replaced. They operate at fractions of a second slower than the old gates, so please come to a complete stop when scanning in your passes and wait until the gate arm goes up completely before proceeding. We know when you arrive, you can't wait to get to your lot, but this procedure will allow you to take a second, smile, and wave to the dispatcher and gate attendants inside!
- All Woodhaven facilities will be closed until 1:00 p.m. on Wednesday, June 8, for all-staff orientation.

The following actions were taken or reported by the Board of Directors at their April 25th, 2022 Meeting. Full meeting minutes will be posted to the Members tab on our website after approval at the June 25th meeting.

- Motion was made to approve the March 28, 2022 Board of Directors' Meeting Minutes. Motion passed with five ayes and one abstention.
- 2. Motion was made to approve the ESAC Board of Review Consent Agenda as presented with the exception of Section 5 Lot 245 and Section 22 Lot 11. Motion passed unanimously.
- Motion was made to reduce the ESAC fine from \$250 to \$200 for Section 5 Lot 245. Motion passed unanimously.
- Motion was made to reduce the ESAC fine from \$250 to \$200 for Section 22 Lot 11. Motion passed unanimously.
- Motion was made to approve the suspension of privileges for Section 3 Lot 249 until the membership papers are completed and the deed is recorded. Motion passed unanimously.
- Motion was made to approve the suspension of privileges for Section 9 Lot 181 until the deed is recorded. Motion passed unanimously.
- 7. Motion was made to approve the election proposal from Election Trust with option 2 (hybrid) for a cost of \$15,693.75. The Election Committee will be on-site the day of ballot counting. Motion passed unanimously.
- Motion was made to approve the proposal from Peerless for Well # 2 Pump and Motor Project for a cost of \$122,929 plus tax and freight which may increase the cost over \$130,000. Motion passed unanimously.



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AQUATICS FACILITIES - RULES & REGULATIONS

POOL 1 & POOL 2 - GENERAL RULES

- Children under the age of ten(10) must be supervised by someone fourteen(14) yrs. old & up OR an adult if determined by staff.
- Bathers with any contagious disease or infectious condition are not allowed in the water.
- Bathers with open cuts or abrasions are not allowed in the water.
- Proper swimming attire is required in the pool. Swimsuits must have a proper lining; no cut-offs, no shorts without lining, no bra's /training bra's.
- Children who are not toilet trained must wear a swim diaper.
- Only clean footwear, baby strollers, and wheelchairs are allowed on the pool deck and in the bathhouse.
- Only clean swim shoes are allowed in the water.
- All bathers are encouraged to shower prior to entering the water. Bathers may be required to shower as determined by staff.
- Stay clear of lifeguards and do not converse with them while on duty.
- No alcohol allowed, no intoxicated individuals allowed.
- Food and drink are limited to designated areas only. No glass containers allowed.
- No foul language/horseplay. No loud music or yelling.
- Smoking is not allowed.
- Fence must remain clear.
- No running on the deck.
- Do not walk in, stand on, or jump from the pool gutter.
- Personal floatation device(PFD) users must be supervised and in the shallow water only.
- No floatable toys, rafts, balls, etc. are allowed in the main pool.
- Stay clear of stairs and ladders except to enter/exit.
- The pool must close and patrons must exit entire facility when thunder is heard or lightning is seen, including a 15 minute period after the last lightning or thunder detected.
- ALL swimmers must exit the pool following a fecal or vomit accident until water is tested, cleaned, and treated(30 min.)
- Actions that are unsafe or a nuisance to others will be determined and
- restricted by staff.
- No pets are allowed in any areas.

POOL 2 - WATER SLIDE RULES

- One person on the slide at a time.
- Enter/exit slide feet first only.
- Do no slow or stop in slide.
- Swim away from and exit the slide area immediately at the nearest ladder.
- Actions that are unsafe or a nuisance to others will be determined and retricted by staff.

BEACH - FLOATING DOCK

- Jump off sides and front of dock only.
- No diving or flips off the dock.
- No swimming under the dock.
- Enter dock from ladder steps only.
- Actions that are unsafe or a nuisance to others will be determined and retricted by staff.
- No sitting in the guard chair.

POOL 1 & POOL 2 - CHILDREN'S POOL RULES

- The children's pool is for those six(6) yrs. old and under, with an adult supervising.
- Guardians will be responsible for the conduct of their children; it is their responsibility to see their children observe the rules.
- No food or drink allowed in the children's pool area.
- Proper swimming attire is required of all in the area.
- No running.
- Children with cuts/abrasions should not use any swimming facility.
- Actions that are unsafe or a nuisance to others will be determined and restricted by staff.

POOL 1 - DIVING BOARD RULES

- One person on the board at a time.
- Do not step on the board until the previous diver has reached the exit ladder.
- Do not run on the board.
- Take only one bounce and leave the board from your feet.
- Dive straight out from the end of the board.
- Exit the diving area at the nearest ladder only.
- Actions that are unsafe or a nuisance to others will be determined and restricted by staff.

POOL 1 - CONCESSION AREA RULES

- No food or beverage is allowed outside the area.
- Glass bottles, plates, or containers are not allowed in the area.
- Please place trash in designated receptacles.

BEACH - GENERAL RULES

- No swimming without lifeguard on duty.
- Children under the age of ten(10) must be supervised by someone fourteen(14) yrs. old & up OR an adult if determined by staff.
- Swimmers must stay within the marked lines. Water is shallow(under 5 feet) to the first line, and deep(over 5 feet) past the first line.
- Do not hang over lines/floats; swim under.
- No alcohol, no intoxicated individuals.
- No foul language or loud music.
- No pets allowed on the beach or in the water.
- Children who are not toilet trained must wear a swim diaper.
- Floatables are subject to use restriction.
- Staff may restrict use of balls and toys.
- No throwing sand, dunking, or "horseplay."
- No swimming in long or baggy pants.
- Stay clear of lifeguards and do not converse with them while on duty.
- Actions that are unsafe or a nuisance to others will be determined and restricted by staff.

When displaying the flag ...



From your porch, place the union (blue section) at the peak of the staff.



Against a wall or on a window, place the union (blue section) at the top left corner.



On your vehicle, clamp the staff to the right front fender.



With another flag, place the U.S. flag to your left when crossed.



Keep your flag completely dry and folded properly - into a triangle, with the union (blue section) visible - before storing it in a well-ventilated area. If the flag is damaged or worn out, it should be disposed of with dignity.



The flag should not touch anything below it or rest on the ground.

Welcome Spring; it's that time of the year when the Stars are bright, and the Fire Pits are blazing! Fire Safety Reminders:


- Never leave your fire unattended.

Taxes vs Assessments...

Woodhaven is definitely a great place to get away from the grinds of daily life—work, traffic & noise. As with most hobbies and recreational activities, however, there are varying degrees of financial costs and expenses that go along with the fun and relaxation, and Woodhaven is no exception.

When you make the commitment to yourself and your family to purchase recreational property at Woodhaven, you also make the pledge to accept the accompanying financial responsibilities. Two of the primary financial obligations involved at Woodhaven are the annual Association assessments and the yearly county property taxes. There is often a misconception that the assessment and county tax bill are one in the same. It's very important to learn and know the differences between these two expenses, what they provide, and who they are paid to.

Annual Association Assessment

When you purchase property at Woodhaven, you become a member of the Woodhaven Association. As a member of the Association, you are responsible to fund your ownership share of the Association's annual budget. This budget includes annual operating costs, such as cost to operate facilities, including the pools, water and sewer facilities and other amenities; providing programs and services; and maintenance of buildings and common grounds. Also included in the annual budget is a reserve fund, which sets aside a certain amount of cash for future improvements, emergencies or unexpected repairs and improvements.

Every year Woodhaven's Board of Directors and volunteer committees spend months reviewing past budgets and working with staff to determine current and future budgetary needs based on goals set by the Board. Through this process, the Board then determines each individual property's share based on the number of billable properties at Woodhaven and Woodhaven's overall budgetary needs. The budget process is well documented through the *Woodhaven News* and allows Property Owner input at several stages of the process. The process culminates in November of each year when the proposed budget for the upcoming fiscal year is presented to the members in an open meeting. The following fiscal year budget is typically approved by the Board of Directors at the December Board meeting. After the Board approves the budget, including the amount to be billed to each individual Property Owner, staff begins preparing the assessment bills, which are typically mailed to Property Owners in January each year, with a March 31 due date for the first installment payment.

It is important to understand that the individual annual assessment amount is based on the number of billable properties located at Woodhaven. Therefore, every billable lot with sewer service is billed the exact same assessment amount. Also, every lot without sewer service is billed the same amount as every other lot in Woodhaven without sewer service. And because the assessments are actually billed to each billable lot, Property Owners that own multiple lots are required to pay an assessment for each lot they own.

Property Taxes

If you own a home or property somewhere other than Woodhaven, then you are probably well aware of what property taxes are and how they are assessed. For all others, property tax on real estate is typically levied by local government at the municipal or county level and they help support local education, police/fire protection, local governments and other local infrastructure. The tax is usually assessed at a percentage of two components—the value of the land, and any improvements or building value.

At Woodhaven, assessed land values can vary greatly depending upon location within the property. For example, property on a lake would be assessed at a higher value than a lot not located near water. Structures and improvements at Woodhaven that can be assessed include free standing room additions, covered decks, and sheds. Park models, travel trailers, fifthwheels and other RVs cannot be assessed as they are considered personal property.

Woodhaven properties are located in Lee County, and as such, are taxed by Lee County Treasurer's Office. With more than 1,700 acres of property, Woodhaven encompasses two different townships and two different fire protection districts. Because of this, similar campsites may be assessed at slightly different rates based on what township or fire protection district they are located in. Tax bills in Lee County are usually mailed out in April or May of each year with due dates of June and September. A notice is included each year in the *Woodhaven News* when the Lee County tax bills are mailed.

It is important to know that these bills are mailed directly to the residential address of the property owner listed on the deed. If you, as a Property Owner, ever have a home change of address, you need to contact Lee County Treasurer's Office to provide them with the most current information so your tax bill can reach you. Remember, you are responsible for payment of your county taxes whether you received a bill in the mail or not! We have seen many situations where Property Owners have lost ownership of their lot to non-payment of taxes because the bill was not being sent to the correct address. The Lee County Treasurer's Office can be reached at 815-288-4477; Woodhaven will not be able to answer questions regarding specific tax bills.

Hopefully, this clears up any uncertainty or confusion between the annual association assessments and county tax bills. If you have any further questions, please don't hesitate to contact Woodhaven Association's Office at 815-849-5209.

White Tailed Deer Population Survey Conducted

On the evening of April 5, a deer population survey was conducted on Woodhaven property to get an initial assessment of the numbers of deer on property. The United States Department of Agriculture-Wildlife Services were contracted to conduct the survey with the assistance of Woodhaven Resource staff. In addition to

the goal of assessing the deer population, the survey also served as training for Woodhaven staff to conduct ongoing population assessments.

A predetermined route was set in order to cover a large area of the property. By establishing a set route, future surveys can be conducted using this same route thus giving consistency to surveys. Numbers collected in these surveys can then be compared in order to discern trends in the population. Are deer numbers steady, increasing, or decreasing?

Why are we assessing the deer population? If you have been following the articles in the Woodhaven News the past 2 years, you will understand the impacts of a large deer population on the environment, motor vehicles and the herd. Without any natural predators or other outside control, the number of deer will continue to increase. We are exploring the need and feasibility of managing the deer population to reduce numbers and maintain a healthy population.

You might think that the hunters outside of the property are having an impact on the population during the hunting seasons. Yes, these hunters are taking deer out of the population but not enough to have an impact on the overall population. Though there is hunting all around the outside of the property during the designated hunting seasons, the deer know they are safe within Woodhaven and tend to stay during the hunting seasons. The other side of this is that most hunters do not harvest enough does. Some hunters chose to target only trophy bucks and pass on the does. Removing only the bucks does not impact the deer population overall. To have an impact on the deer population, hunters would need to remove more does as a mature doe can have 2-3 fawns each season. Without any control, one can see the numbers will climb quickly over a few years.

On the evening of the deer survey, there were 163 deer counted. There was an additional 17 deer counted just beyond our property line. Doing the math, this represents 180 deer. Looking at the 163 deer counted on the property, this equates to roughly 64 deer per square mile. I believe we can surmise that the deer herd is most likely closer to 200 plus as there were areas on the route not visible from the road as well as the areas that were not included. Literature on whitetail deer populations indicates roughly 21 deer per square mile as a healthy number for a deer population.

I would like to hear from the membership about your perspectives on the deer herd via Speak-Up Sheet, letter, or email. Email: jcorcoran@woodhavenassociation.com. What impact have deer had on you, both positive and negative? I have heard from some of you relating to adverse effects on your landscape plantings over the years. Others have voiced concern about the herd's health overall due to the high numbers of deer and the risks of disease. Trees planted over the years by the Resource department and Proper-



Stop the spread of invasive species





Take some time this June and spend it outdoors around Woodhaven! In our busy lives, we need to take a break and go outside to enjoy what nature has to offer. There are many reports about the healing properties of just spending 15-minutes outside daily. I would like to challenge you to spend 15-minutes this month sitting outside using your senses, listening and watching the nature around you in the early evening. What could you find or hear? Listen for frogs calling. We have a variety of frogs around Woodhaven, including bullfrogs bellowing, green frog that sound like a plucked banjo string, chorus frogs that sound like your finger running over the teeth of a comb, and tree frogs trilling. Nighttime birds like owls could also be calling or an early evening cardinal. Later in June, watch for some early lightning bugs flickering through the night or watch the stars and try to identify a constellation or two. 



Beware of Invasive Species! Our focus this month will be on an invasive species of plant. (If you would like to know more about the difference between invasive, native, and nonnative species, please refer to the April 2022 Naturalist Corner newspaper article.)

Wild Parsnip (Pastinaca sativa) can be found throughout Illinois, starting to bloom in early June through September. Wild parsnip is a non-native, invasive plant that can grow anywhere and invades natural areas, especially prairies and savanna areas, as well as wet areas, pastures, fields, along roadsides, and vacant lots. Why is wild parsnip a problem? This plant is considered a noxious weed. It can be a problem in our native areas as it can displace native species, disrupting our





many branching tiny yellow flowers. The plant spreads by reseeding itself and can take an area over within a few years. It likes areas with full or partial





sun. This plant typically has a two-year life cycle, with first-year plants having a clump of leaves and second-year plants flowering, seeding, and dying. Wild parsnip is in the Carrot Family, including Queen-Anne's Lace (invasive), which looks similar but has white flowers with one deep-red one in the center. Other similar plants include Golden Alexanders (native flowers with only three leaflets and smooth, shiny stem) and Cow Parsnip (native with white flowers).





done before seeds appear and may need to repeat a few times. Leave plants to dry completely. Do not compost or burn.

Be safe around wild parsnip! The entire plant is toxic, especially the sap. When the sap or juice of the wild parsnip comes in contact with skin in the presence of sunlight, it can be irritating and cause a chemical burn which can look like a rash with blistering and discoloration of the skin. Everyone is susceptible to wild parsnip sap reactions! Wild parsnip sap is not an oil like poison ivy sap (urushiol), so soap and water or plain water can effectively remove or dilute the sap and prevent skin damage if done in a timely manner. If you have had sap on your skin, keep the area covered for at least 48 hours to prevent a reaction and seek out the help of a medical professional. Wash clothing worn with soap and water as soon as done and don't mix with
