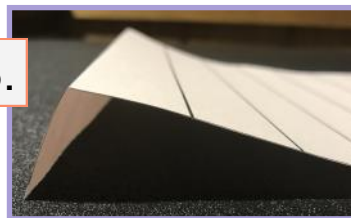
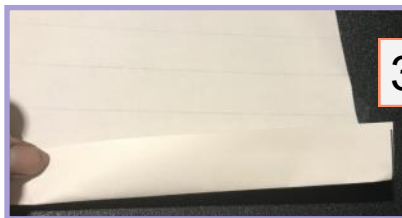
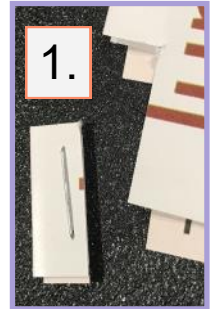
Nature Optical Illusion Art

Directions

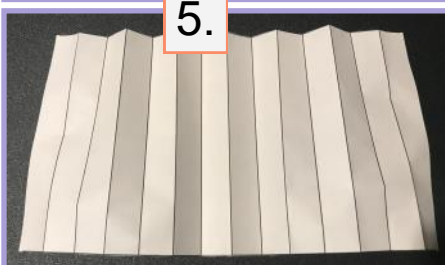
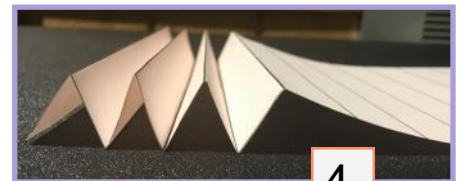
Materials: Pink paper with template, two calendar pages, scissors, glue stick

Directions:

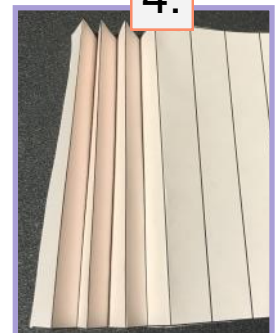
1. Remove the staple at the corner of packet. Set the calendar pages aside.
2. Trim sides of pink paper with black lines.
3. Accordion fold on black lines. Make sure you fold away from you first (with the lines facing up). Use the picture as a guide.



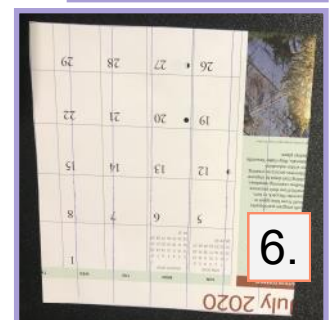
4. As you continue, alternate the direction you fold your paper.

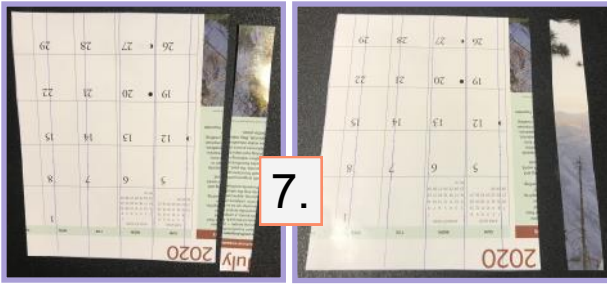


5. Once all the folds are made, you should have an accordion style page. Carefully stretch out the paper so it's mostly flat again. Set aside.



6. On the back side of the calendar pages there are blue lines. Cut along the outer lines. This should give you a rectangle.





7. Then cut the strips out starting at one end, working across image. As you cut, flip the strip over but make sure the image is not upside down.



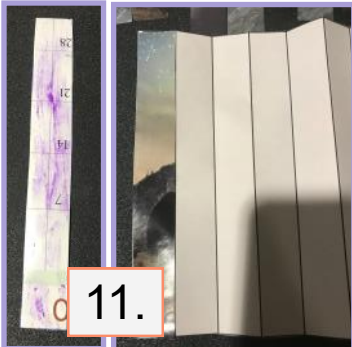
8. Then lay the pieces out in the order you cut them. This will help later.



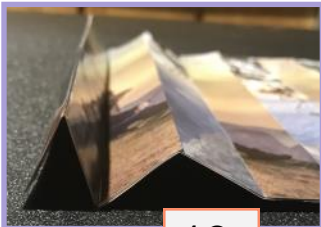
9. Repeat steps 5 and 6 for your other calendar page.



10. Now that both calendars are cut, alternate the image strips. Use the pictures as a guide. This will help you create the optical illusion.



11. Start from one end. Put glue on back of first calendar strip. Put it in place starting at one end of the image working across. Pay close attention to the order.

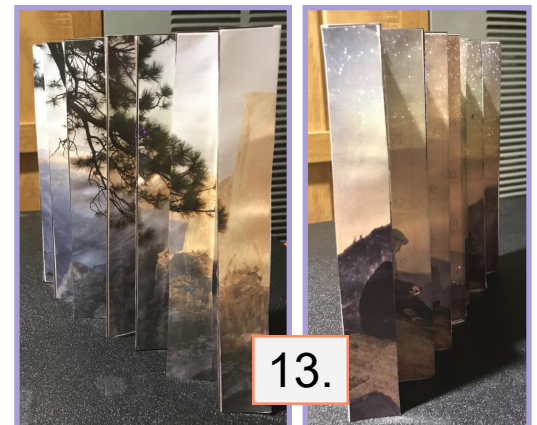


12. Continue alternating the images as you glue them to the outline paper.



13. Fold the paper back up to reveal the optical illusion! Change the

direction you look to see a new picture!



***Optional At Home: If you feel your craft needs extra stability you can glue it to a piece of cardboard or strong paper.
