## SKIRTING

## Second Class Permit with First Class Setbacks Required

Woodhaven Rules and Regulations, Article VII, Section 70.

- 1. Skirting may be used to enclose the perimeter under and around a recreational vehicle, add-aroom or deck. A Second Class permit noting the materials to be used and structure to be skirted is required.
- 2. Acceptable materials include: lattice, solid wood panels which have been painted or stained to match the existing structure, manufactured RV panels/skirting designed for this purpose, or vinyl panels.
- 3. Skirting may not exceed 3' in height; and must be securely attached to the recreational vehicle, add-a-room or deck. Skirting which cannot be attached directly under and around a recreational vehicle, add-a-room, or deck; may be constructed with no more than 6" between the structure and skirting and may not exceed 3' in height. The skirting needs to be securely attached and/or supported to prevent the skirting from being damaged by weather, animals, etc.
- 4. Areas which require more than a 3' high skirting panel due to terrain issues will be permitted and noted on the Second Class permit application. Foundation walls, poured or block; and ground coverage other than gravel, within a skirted area is prohibited.
- Use of doors. If access under the structure is needed, only one 36" high and 48" wide, door/access panel may be used, and may be used, and must blend in with the rest of the skirting used.

Setback: Equal to structure setbacks.
